The town council of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas convened in a regular session on February 20, 2018 at 5:00 p.m. in the council chambers, located at 1075 Ronald Reagan Avenue. Notice of the meeting was posted as required by Title 5, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code. The following members were present and constituted a quorum of members:

Mayor Clark called the meeting to order at 5:10 p.m.

Mayor Clark led the Pledge of Allegiance to the U.S. and Texas Flags.

Councilmember Kenney gave the invocation.

Item B - Public Hearing

<u>B (1) - Public Hearing: To hear public opinion regarding whether the continued operation of the</u> mobile home park, commonly known as Hickory Creek Estates, at the property legally described as A1163A J.W. Simmons, TR 37, 19.795 Acres (located South of Swisher Road, East of Ronald Reagan Avenue, North of Turbeville Road and West of Point Vista Road), and commonly known as 1500 Turbeville Road, Hickory Creek, Texas 76226, which is a nonconforming use under the Town of Hickory Creek Code of Ordinances, has an adverse effect on nearby properties.

Mayor Clark called the public hearing to order at 5:14 p.m.

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Arthur J. Anderson, 2728 N. Harwood Street Suite 500, Dallas, Texas 75201, representing the landowner of 1500 Turbeville Road, stated the landowner objects to the hearing and requests the town council determine the use of the property does not have an adverse impact on nearby properties for the following reasons: The landowner has not been provided evidence the property is located within the corporate limits of Hickory Creek. If the property was properly annexed, then the use is grandfathered under Texas Local Government code and the town is legally prohibited from terminating use. The mobile home park was developed and in operation prior to the development of nearby properties. There is no evidence the mobile home park adversely impacts the value or operation of nearby commercial businesses. DCAD records indicate no significant difference in value between houses in close proximity to the property and those further away.

With no one else wishing to speak, Mayor Clark closed the public hearing at 5:18 p.m.

Alan Pursley, Appraisal Source, Inc., presented information regarding 1500 Turbeville Road, which included, the character of the neighborhood surrounding Hickory Creek Estates, the degree of incompatibility of the use to the zoning district which it is located and other factors relevant to the issue of whether continued operation of the use will adversely affect nearby properties.
