Public Comment

Ron Furtick, 1500 Turbeville Road, stated six months ago, he watched as the council passed a new law. He believes he has complied with this new law. He fully intends to continue complying in the future. Without a vibrant downtown providing retail sales tax, the town council will be forced to raise taxes on property owners in town every year like clockwork for decades to come. He would like for the council to change the zoning on his property to create a walkable downtown area. Mr. Furtick stated If the council continues to harass him and his business interest, he will ground lease his property for the next 50 years to the highest bidder based on the current zoning.

John Moore, 155 Overly Drive, Lake Dallas, is an independent associate with LegalShield. He stated the recent Equifax data breach could affect 143 million people. LegalShield offers a voluntary benefit for employees to help reduce absenteeism, to increase productivity and help reduce stress. WHEREAS, upon full review and consideration of the Agreement, and all matters attendant and related thereto, the Town Council is of the opinion that the terms and conditions thereof should be approved, and that the Mayor shall be authorized to execute it on behalf of the Town of Hickory Creek.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas:

Section 1: That the Mayor of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas, is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas, the Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A.

TrafficPayment Service Agreement

Important – Read Carefully: This is an agreement between The Payment Group, LLC and its division, TRAFFICPAYMENT.COM ("TP"), a Texas limited liability company, and the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas ("Client"), for the license of TP online citation payment service, associated software, hardware, media materials, and electronic documentation. Client and TP are collectively referred to in this agreement as the "Parties". The purpose of this agreement is to state the terms and conditions under which TP will provide for Client *telephone citation payment services* and/or online citation payment services to individuals who have received citation(s) from Client for traffic or other legal violations ("End User").

Agreement

- 1. <u>Services Provided:</u> TP will provide online citation payment services 24 hours a day, and pay-by-phone services via toll-free number during normal business hours. TP will also provide ancillary services for Client, including all necessary installation/setup, promotional assistance, credit card processing, payments to client's specified account(s), and access to real time online reporting. Client agrees to retain the service of TP to act as an agent for the limited purpose of receiving and processing debit and credit card payments. Client agrees to promptly clear all citations upon notice or posting by TP that payment for such citations has been received by TP. If a "chargeback" to a credit/debit card occurs, TP will handle the matter and make the proper adjustment on the next Client report, and Client will then reinstate the affected citation(s) as remaining outstanding and unpaid.
- 2. <u>Timing of Contract:</u> TP will furnish the necessary setup and perform all services required to begin processing citation payments within twenty- four (24) hours, or as soon as is practicable thereafter, of the time this contract and other paperwork are completed and received by TP.
- 3. <u>Property of TP:</u> All computer programs, written procedures, promotional materials, and other supporting items used in the work performed for Client shall be the property of TP, and shall be returned upon termination of this agreement.
- 4. <u>Hardware and Software Requirements:</u> In order to access posting of payments and view online reports, and communicate with TP, Client needs the following: Access to the Internet and ability to browse to TP administration website, an email address, an up-to-date copy of Adobe Reader to view reports, and a telephone line for TP to communicate with Client when a payment is received or for any other common communication.
- 5. Information Provided by Client: Client must provide the following to TP prior to startup:
 - a) Any and all standard contact information;
 - b) Bank routing number, bank account number (if using direct deposit); and
 - c) Bank account type for deposit of all payments (if using direct deposit).
- 6. Actions to be Performed by TP: TP will provide toll free pay-by-phone service during business hours, and paper check or electronic payment to the Client for all citations paid using TP. TP will provide all necessary technical support to maintain the payment system 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. TP will send or electronically deposit funds to Client on Wednesday of each week for the previous week's (Monday-Sunday) activity to the account or address specified.
- 7. <u>Term and Cancellation of Contract</u>: The term of this agreement shall begin on the date executed by both parties and shall continue in full force and effect from that date until it is terminated by thirty (30) days written notice from either party to the other.
- 8. <u>Indemnity:</u> To the extent allowed by law TP will hold harmless the Client for causes of action and damages resulting from the wrongful arrest of defendants due to TP's negligence in processing and reporting payments in accordance with this Agreement. Client will hold harmless TP for causes of action and damages resulting from the wrongful arrest of defendants due to Client's negligence in processing payments or errors in information generated by Client and furnished to TP. The liability of either Party to the other with respect to this Agreement shall not include any contingent liability or exemplary or consequential damages.
- 9. Reservation: All rights not expressly granted in this agreement are reserved by TP.
- 10. <u>Support Services:</u> TP will provide Client with support services related to all aspects of TP citation payment service. The TP web portal, software applications, electronic payments, online reports, and promotional materials are the specific services supported. Client may contact TP support services during business hours Monday through Friday 8:00am to 5:00pm, CST. It is understood that TP will charge End Users a processing fee for the use of its services, and in no event shall Client ever be responsible for any such fee.

- 11. <u>Attorney Fees and Costs:</u> If any action at law or in equity is necessary to enforce or interpret the terms of this agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees, costs, and necessary disbursements in addition to any other relief to which such party may be entitled.
- 12. <u>Promotional Materials:</u> Client agrees to the following for promotional purposes: *a.* to allow TP to use any logo or trademark of Client on the TP website for Client Identification if deemed necessary by TP; and *b.* to allow TP to send promotional material to Client regarding TP services for Client to display on-site reflecting TP as an authorized agent of Client to receive payment of traffic and parking citations. The use of these materials is optional and Client is in no way obligated to use or display.

13. Miscellaneous Provisions:

- a. *Texas Law to apply:* This provision shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created under this agreement are performable in the State of Texas.
- b. *Parties Bound*: This agreement shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors, and assigns.
- c. Legal Construction: In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, that invalidity, illegality or unenforceable shall not affect any other provision of this agreement, and this agreement shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision was not contained in the agreement.
- d. Sole Agreement. This agreement constitutes the sole agreement of the parties and supercedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements between the parties respecting the subject matter of this agreement.

Consider and act on a development agreement between the Town of Hickory Creek and Cornelius Center Investors, L.L.P. regarding public improvements to Turbeville Road and Point Vista Road.

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN CORNELIUS CENTER INVESTORS, L.L.P., AND THE TOWN OF HICKORY CREEK, TEXAS

This Development Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas, a Type A general-law municipality, (the "Town") and Cornelius Center Investors, L.L.P., (the "Developer").

WHEREAS, the Developer is the owner of that certain tract of land more particularly described in Exhibit "A" (the "Property"), and

WHEREAS, the Developer agrees to dedicate certain right of way in partial fulfillment of its obligation to share in the costs of certain road improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Developer agrees to participate in the funding of improvements to Turbeville Road; and whereas, said funding is in an amount that is proportional to the burden that will be placed on road infrastructure by the future development of the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and conditions contained in this Agreement, the Town, and Developer agree as follows:

- 1. **Incorporation of Recitals.** The representations, covenants and recitations set forth in the foregoing recitals of this Agreement are true and correct, are incorporated into the body of this Agreement and are adopted as findings of the Town and the authorized representatives of the Developer.
- 2. **Land Subject to Agreement.** The land that is subject to this Agreement is the Property. Developer represents that it is the sole owner of the Property.
- 3. **Obligations.**
 - (a) Within thirty (30) days after notice from the Town, Developer shall, at no cost to the Town, dedicate by Special Warranty Deed, in the form approved by the Town the required right of way for Turbeville Road adjacent to the Property consisting of 0.3375 acres and the required right of way for Point Vista Road adjacent to the Property consisting of 0.5191 acres.
 - (b) Within thirty (30) days of commencing development of the Property, Developer shall pay to the Town \$50,000.00 as a portion of its roadway fee.
 - (c) Within thirty (30) days of completion of one-third of the development of the Property, Developer shall pay to the Town \$100,000.00 as the final share of its roadway fee.

- (d) Developer shall provide water, at no cost to the Town, for maintenance of landscaping on the Turbeville Road median which is adjacent to the Property.
- (e) Town shall construct a new 5 wire fence on the Property fronting Turbeville Road and Point Vista Road.
- (f) Upon full performance of Developer's obligations under this Agreement the Town shall not require any additional funding for roadways from Developer related to development of the Property.
- (g) Town shall, before construction of road improvements commences, provide road, lighting, and landscape plans consistence with Exhibit B. Town shall timely undertake design and construction of improvements to Turbeville Road and Point Vista Road adjacent to the Property

4. **Default.**

- (a) If Developer fails to comply with any provision of this Agreement, and such failure is not cured within thirty (30) days after the Town sends written notice of such failure to Developer, then the Town shall have the following remedies, in addition to the Town's other rights and remedies:
 - (i) to file this instrument in the Real Property Records of Denton County, Texas as a lien or encumbrance on the Property;
 - (ii) to refuse to issue building permits for any building on the Property;
 - (iii) immediately enforce the Town's Ordinance related to roadway proportionality fees through imposition of the full amount of fees in effect at the time such fees are due and making such fees immediately due and payable in an amount equal to the difference between any roadway fees already tendered to the Town by Developer and the total assessed roadway fees;
 - (iv) to refuse to issue a Certificate of Occupancy for the Property; and/or
 - (v) to seek specific enforcement of this Agreement.
- (b) If the Town fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this Agreement and such failure is not cured within thirty (30) days after the Town received written notice of such failure from Developer, then Developer may seek specific enforcement of this Agreement as its sole and exclusive remedy.

- 5. <u>Limitations of Liability.</u> Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, the parties agree and acknowledge that the Town shall not, under any circumstances, be required to tender, or be liable to Developer for, any credit or reimbursement of, or payment of any monies, with regard to the matters set forth herein.
- 6. <u>**Covenant Running with the Land.</u>** This Agreement shall be a covenant running with the land and Property and shall be binding upon Developer. The parties shall cause this Agreement to be filed in the Real Property Records of Denton County, Texas. Developer represents and warrants that the filing of this Agreement as provided herein shall provide the Town with a superior and priority encumbrance, lien or interest in, on and to the Property as to any and all other persons or entities (collectively, "the Town's Priority Lien"). Notwithstanding the foregoing, the obligations herein that burden the Property shall be released upon final payment of the proper roadway fees.</u>
- 7. <u>Limitations of Agreement.</u> The parties acknowledge that of the fees that are or may be payable by Developer to the Town, this Agreement addresses only the roadway fees prescribed by the Town Ordinance. The Town ordinances covering property taxes, permit fees, inspection fees, tree mitigation fees, development fees, and the like are not affected by this Agreement. Further, this Agreement does not waive or limit any of the obligations of Developer to the Town under any ordinance whether now existing or in the future arising.
- 8. <u>Notices.</u> Any notice provided or permitted to be given under this Agreement must be in writing and may be served by depositing same in the United States Mail, addressed to the Party to be notified, postage pre-paid and registered or certified with return receipt requested; by facsimile; by electronic mail, with documentation evidencing the addressee's receipt thereof; or by delivering the same in person to such Party via hand-delivery service, or any courier service that provides a return receipt showing the date of actual delivery of same to the address of the addressee. For purposes of notification, the addresses of the parties shall be as follows:

- (b) DEVELOPERS RELEASES THE TOWN FROM ANY AND ALL CLAIMS OR CAUSES OF ACTION BASED ON EXCESSIVE OR ILLEGAL EXACTIONS.
- (c) DEVELOPER WAIVES ANY CLAIM FOR DAMAGES OR REIMBURSEMENT AGAINST THE TOWN FOR VIOLATION OF ANY FEDERAL OR STATE CONSTITUTION, STATUTE OR CASE LAW OR ANY FEDERAL, STATE OR LOCAL ORDINANCE, RULE OR REGULATION.
- (d) THIS <u>PARAGRAPH</u> SHALL SURVIVE THE TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.
- 11. <u>Vested Rights/Chapter 245 Waiver.</u> The parties shall be subject to all ordinances of the Town, whether now existing or in the future arising. This Agreement shall confer no vested rights on the Property, or any portion thereof, unless specifically enumerated herein. In addition, nothing contained in this Agreement shall constitute a "permit" as defined in Chapter 245 of the Texas Local Government Code, as amended, and nothing in this Agreement provides the Town with fair notice of any project of Developer. <u>DEVELOPER WAIVES ANY STATUTORY CLAIM</u> <u>UNDER CHAPTER 245 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE,</u> <u>AS AMENDED, UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. - 12. <u>Attorney's Fees.</u> If either Party files any action or brings any proceeding against the other arising from this Agreement, then as between Developer and the Town, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover as an element of its costs of suit, and not as damages, reasonable and necessary attorneys' fees and litigation expenses both at trial and on appeal, subject to the limitations set forth in TEX. LOC. GOV'T CODE § 271.153, as it exists or may be amended, if applicable.
- 13. <u>Warranties/Representations.</u> All warranties, representations and covenants made by one party to the other in this Agreement or in any certificate or other instrument delivered by one party to the other under this Agreement shall be considered to have been relied upon by the other party and will survive the satisfaction of any fees under this Agreement regardless of any investigation made by either party.
- 14. <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the matters contained herein and may not be modified or terminated except upon the provisions hereof or by the mutual written agreement of the parties.
- 15. <u>Governing Law: Venue.</u> The laws of the State of Texas shall govern the interpretation, validity, performance and enforcement of this Agreement, without regard to conflict of law principles. This Agreement is performable in Denton County, Texas, and the exclusive venue for any action arising out of this Agreement shall be a court of appropriate jurisdiction in Denton County, Texas.
- 16. <u>Consideration</u>. This Agreement is executed by the parties without coercion or duress and for substantial consideration, the sufficiency of which is forever confessed.
- 17. <u>Multiple Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be executed in a number of identical counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original for all purposes. An electronic mail or facsimile signature will also be deemed to constitute an original if properly executed and delivered to the other party.
- 18. <u>Authority to Execute.</u> The individuals executing this Agreement on behalf of the respective parties below represent to each other and to others that all appropriate and necessary action has been taken to authorize the individual who is executing this Agreement to do so for and on behalf of the party for which his or her signature appears, that there are no other parties or entities required to execute this Agreement in order for the same to be an authorized and binding agreement on the party for whom the individual is signing this Agreement and that each individual affixing his or her signature hereto is authorized to do so, and such authorization is valid and effective on the Effective Date (hereinafter defined). The parties agree that the performance of the parties under this Agreement is authorized by Section 212.072 of the Texas Local Government Code.

- 19. <u>Savings: Severability.</u> In the event that a term, condition or provision of this Agreement is determined to be invalid, illegal, void, unenforceable or unlawful by a court of competent jurisdiction, then that term, condition or provision shall be deleted and the remainder of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect as if such invalid, illegal, void, unenforceable or unlawful provision had never been contained in this Agreement.
- 20. <u>**Representations.**</u> Each party represents that it has carefully read this Agreement, knows the contents hereof, has consulted with an attorney of its choice regarding the meaning and effect hereof and is signing the same solely of its own judgment.
- 21. <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries.</u> Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create any right in any third party not a signatory to this Agreement, and the parties do not intend to create any third party beneficiaries by entering into this Agreement.

22. Assignment/Binding Effect.

- (a) This Agreement is assignable, in whole or in part, upon the following conditions, all of which must be satisfied before any such assignment shall be valid and enforceable:
 - (i) the assignment of the Agreement must be evidenced by a recordable document ("Assignment"), the form of which must be approved in writing by the Town;
 - (ii) the Assignment must expressly contain, among any other reasonable requirements and conditions of the Town, and acknowledgment and agreement that all obligations, covenants and conditions contained in this Agreement will be assumed solely and completely by the assignee, and the contact name, address, phone number, fax number and electronic mail address of the assignee;
 - (iii) Developer will file any approved, executed Assignment in the Real Property Records of Denton County, Texas; and
 - (iv) Developer shall provide the Town with a file-marked copy of the Assignment within ten (10) days of filing the same, and until the Town receives said file-marked copy of the Assignment within ten (10) days of filing the same, and until the Town receives said filemarked copy of the Assignment as provided herein, the Town shall not, under any circumstances, recognize said Assignment.

- (b) This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Town and Developer.
- 23. **Indemnification.** The Parties agree that the Indemnity provisions set forth herein are conspicuous, and the parties have read and understood the same.
- 24. <u>Waiver.</u> Waiver by either party of any breach of this Agreement, or the failure of either party to enforce any of the provisions of this Agreement, at any time, shall not in any way affect, limit or waive such party's right thereafter to enforce and compel strict compliance.
- 25. <u>Immunity.</u> It is expressly understood and agreed that, in the execution and performance of this Agreement, the Town has not waived, nor shall be deemed hereby to have waived, any defense or immunity, including governmental, sovereign and official immunity, that would otherwise be available to it against claims arising in the exercise of governmental powers and functions. By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not create any obligations, express or implied, other than those set forth herein.
- 26. <u>Reference to Developer.</u> When referring to "Developer" herein, this Agreement shall refer to and be binding upon Developer and Developer's officers, directors, partners, employees, representatives, contractors, agents, successors, assignees (as authorized herein), vendors, grantees, trustees, legal representative and any other third parties for whom Developer is legally responsible.
- 27. <u>Reference to The Town.</u> When referring to "The Town" herein, this Agreement shall refer to and be binding upon the Town and the Town's Council Members, officers, agents, representatives, employees and any other authorized third parties for whom the Town is legally responsible.
- 28. <u>Miscellaneous Drafting Provisions.</u> This Agreement shall be deemed drafted equally by all parties hereto. The language of all parts of this Agreement shall be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning, and any presumption or principle that the language herein is to be construed against any party shall not apply. Headings in this Agreement are for the convenience of the parties and are not intended to be used in construing this document.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have executed this Agreement and caused this Agreement to be effective when all the parties have signed it. The date this Agreement is signed by the last party to sign it (as indicated by the date associated with the party's signature below) will be deemed the effective date of this Agreement ("Effective Date").



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The terms and conditions as cited in this document, apply to any and all sales of radar speed signs supplied by Elan City Inc. Accessories, such as batteries, are covered by a separate and different warranty labeled "battery warranty", included below. Completion and signature of this document is a binding contract. This document must be completed and signed by buyer / client at the time of initial purchase and each future purchase of Elan City Inc. products.

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DELIVERY OF GOODS

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Upon delivery of all goods, the client is required to verify the external condition of each package. The client must refuse the entire delivery if the package(s) are not in good condition, and contact Elan City Inc immediately. The client is required to verify that the quantities noted on the packing list are in accord with those delivered. If packages are in good condition but the quantity is incomplete as to the packing list, the client must indicate this anomaly directly on the transporter's copy of the delivery-note and must immediately inform Elan City Inc. The liability of potential damage to delivered goods and / or missing packages cannot be attributed to the carrier nor to Elan City Inc. after delivery and suite to non-conformity of these instructions by the buyer.

Good condition and correct quantity of contents of package must be verified within 5 days of delivery. The device must also be tested within these 5 days of delivery to establish its correct functionality. Beyond the 5 days, the payment cannot be contested by the buyer if the device and its accessories are found to be "dead on delivery" and / or malfunctioning and / or missing. Payment must be made within 30 days of receiving the invoice as indicated on the signed contract (quote).
