#### STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF DENTON TOWN OF HICKORY CREEK

The town council of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas convened in a special session on January 30, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. in the council chambers, located at 1075 Ronald Reagan Avenue. Notice of the meeting was posted as required by Title 5, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code. The following members were present and constituted a quorum of members:

Mayor Clark called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Clark led the Pledge of Allegiance to the U.S. and Texas Flags.

Councilmember Theodore gave the invocation.

#### **Presentation of Awards**

T.J. Gilmore, Waste Management Public Sector Services Representative, presented Lee Haughton, a Waste Management hard hat and safety vest for his time and dedication ensuring good communication was provided during the solid waste services transition.

#### **Items of Community Interest**

Mayor Clark was recognized for her outstanding presentation at the Lake Cities Chamber Luncheon on January 16, 2018.

The Lake Dallas VFW will hold a fundraiser benefiting the Texas Fallen Heroes Foundation, February 3, 2018 from 12:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m.

#### **Public Comment**

Ron Furtick, 1500 Turbeville Road, stated he is deeply disturbed by the state of the town. Over the past fifteen years in meeting with developers, he has told them that he has the best location in Denton County for development. Once it is revealed the land is North of 121 in Lewisville and South of Loop 288 in Denton, he is told the land is in the doughnut hole. The development community does not perceive Hickory Creek as viable for development and that needs to be changed. If the zoning for a walkable, live, work, play community is not passed the community will continue to lose. He would like to move forward and work together.

John Smith, town administrator, provided a visual presentation related to the public hearings scheduled.

B (1) - Public Hearing: To hear public opinion on a request by Studio 13 Design Group on behalf of Hard Sun V, Inc. to change the zoning designation from C-1 (Commercial) to PD (Planned Development) on two tracts of property totaling approximately 1.1 acres of land per the survey in the corporate limits of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas. Said properties are more particularly described as follows: TLC Subdivision Blk A Lot 1 (PT), 1.0104 acres and TLC Subdivision Blk A Lot 1 (C PT) (PT), 0.1116 acres. The property is located at the Northwest corner of Turbeville Road and South Stemmons Freeway.

Mayor Clark called the public hearing to order at 6:44 p.m.

Ron Furtick, 1500 Turbeville Road, stated he is a fan of commercial development. He supports the restaurant. He is confused why EDC purchased the land. He loves the idea of commercial tenants who pay property tax and sales tax to support the economy. It is critical to have a large number of commercial developments. He does not believe commercial development should be subsidized. It could be accomplished by changing zoning.

Mandy Larkin, 105 Lakehill Drive, stated she is excited for a sit-down restaurant to be built in Hickory Creek. She shared her concerns regarding entrances and possible traffic issues.

With no one else wishing to speak, Mayor Clark closed the public hearing at 6:48 p.m.

B (2) - Public Hearing: To hear public opinion on a request by Astra Development to change the zoning designation from SF-3 (Single Family 3) & C-1 (Commercial) to PD (Planned Development) on two tracts of property totaling approximately 21 acres of land per the survey in the corporate limits of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas. Said properties are more particularly described as follows: A0958A McCarroll, Tract 32, 9.515 acres, Old DCAD Tract #9a and A0958A McCarroll, Tract 31, 11.785 acres, Old DCAD Tract #9. The property is located in the 1100 block of Point Vista Road.

Mayor Clark called the public hearing to order at 6:50 p.m.

Mark Allen, 1154 Point Vista Road, stated even though his family is happy about the residential development they do have concerns. The smallest lots in the development are squeezed in the corner and five homes will border his property. In the current plan, the masonry wall along Point Vista Road would be placed in their front yard. The final concern is in regard to the fencing between the existing homes in Lakeview and the homes that are proposed.

Ron Furtick, 1500 Turbeville Road, stated he is deeply disappointed by the development which requires commercial property to be rezoned. Rezoning the property destroys the future economic viability. He does not see the need for additional homes to be built particularly near the freeway and will contribute to the destruction of the civic economy.

### <u>D (1) - Presentation of the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year Audit from Carl Deaton of Hankins, Eastup, Deaton, Tonn & Seay.</u>

Carl Deaton of Hankins, Eastup, Deaton, Tonn & Seay presented the audited financial statements for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017. The assets and deferred outflows of resources of the Town of Hickory Creek exceeded its liabilities at September 30, 2017 by \$11,785,041. Of this amount \$2,628,686 may be used to meet the government's ongoing obligations to citizens and creditors. The town's total net position increased by \$872,807. As of September 30, 2017, the Town of Hickory Creek's governmental funds reported combined ending fund balance of \$5,529,388, a decrease of \$1,254,279 in comparison with the beginning of the period. Approximately 55 percent of this total amount, \$3,020,355 is available for spending at the government's discretion. At the end of the current period, unassigned fund balance for the general fund was \$2,922,301 or 85.24 percent of total general fund expenditures. The audit is required to include the activity of the Economic Development Corporation and for the first year, Public Improvement District No 1, due to the issuance of bonds. The EDC fund balance increased by \$318,422 bringing the total fund balance to \$1,621,429. The Public Improvement District No. 1 total fund balance was \$605,323.







The Town's ordinance does <u>not</u> require minimum lot frontage along a public right street right-of-way, so we can't comment on the lack of lot frontage.

Please note, the owner of Block A, Lot 6A (Randy Wahl according to the Denton CAD) will be responsible for maintaining the common driveway in the access easement.

Halff recommends approval of the Country Oak Estates Addition Minor Plat. The applicant needs to revise the plat to include "A.E." (Access Easement) in the legend before filing the plat.



#### **AGREEMENT**

**THIS AGREEMENT** is by and between the Town of Hickory Creek ("Town") and Flying and Floating Toys ("FFT"). (collectively the "Parties"), and is made and entered into this the 20th day of February, 2018.

#### WITNESSETH:

**WHEREAS,** the Town is a Type A general law municipality, duly incorporated under the laws and Constitution of the State of Texas;

**WHEREAS,** FFT seeks to utilize certain parkland within the Town, which is under the control and supervision of the Town, more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto (the "Property");

**WHEREAS,** the Town desires to enter into an Agreement with FFT in the interest of promoting local business and economic development;

**WHEREAS,** this Agreement is for the commercial operations of Flying and Floating Toys relating to the delivery of rental watercraft only to clients with prior paid reservations;

WHEREAS, no other business operations, transactions or solicitation of business is allowed;

**WHEREAS**, the Town may revoke this permit without notice to FFT in the event FFT violates any provision of this Agreement.

I.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION** of the foregoing, and for other good and valuable consideration described herein, the Parties agree that FFT shall:

- 1.1 Obtain a permit related to the commercial use of boat ramps and payment of any applicable fees.
- 1.2 Provide the Town with proof of adequate commercial liability insurance coverage as is reasonable to commercial operation of a business.
- 1.3 Provide business name, Federal Tax Identification Number, State Tax Identification Number, business address, and business phone numbers to the Town. Any changes to this information must be provided to the Town within 5 business days.
- 1.4 Provide 24-hour emergency contact information to the Town.
- 1.5 Conduct any commercial operations in Point Vista Park only, unless prior written permission has been obtained from the Town. Any request for alternate locations must be submitted to the Town Administrator, or his designee, in writing, a minimum of 5 business days prior to the date requested.

- 1.6 Conduct operations during posted park hours only. There shall be no overnight storage of vehicles or equipment in the park, on its grounds, or on adjacent waters.
- 1.7 Launch all commercially owned equipment in an expedient manner and clear boat launch ramp for public use.
- 1.8 Dry dock all rental equipment at bank. There shall be no staging at courtesy dock before rental client's arrival.
- 1.9 Tie to courtesy dock for no more than 15 minutes to load client's personal supplies.
- 1.10 Communicate any and all operations instructions to clients while dry docked or during the initial rental transaction as to not tie up the courtesy dock for an extended period of time.
- 1.11 Not set up business operations in the park or on its grounds, other than the storage and delivery of rental equipment described above.
- 1.12 Not allow more than one piece of rental equipment to be tied to courtesy dock at any given time thereby allowing public access.
- 1.13 Not park vehicles and trailers in "no parking" areas blocking roadway or creating other hazards.
- 1.14 Register all tow vehicles and trailers with the Town and display a valid annual Park Pass. Unattached trailers shall be allowed with a valid annual Parking Pass, issued by the Town, provided such vehicles are stored in the designated area. Fees for all Passes shall be established by the Town Council.
- 1.15 Park all commercial vehicles or equipment at the farthest northwest end of the parking lot as directed by the Town.
- 1.16 Comply with all provisions of the Town of Hickory Creek's Code of Ordinances.

### II. Term

This Agreement shall commence on the date approved by the Town Council and shall terminate one (1) year from the date of approval. Any additional term(s) shall be at the sole discretion of the Town Council.

### III. Governmental Immunity

Should FFT violate any of the above-referenced obligations, the Town may revoke the permit granted herein without notice.

3.1 Town is a political subdivision of the state and enjoys governmental immunity. By entering into this Agreement, Town does not consent to suit, waive its governmental immunity, or the limitations as to damages under the Texas Tort Claims Act.

### IV. General Provisions

- 4.1 **Amendments.** No amendment to this Agreement shall be effective and binding unless and until it is reduced to writing and signed by duly authorized representatives of both parties.
- 4.2 **Choice of Law and Venue**. This Agreement has been made under and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Performance and all maters related thereto shall be in Denton County, Texas, United States of America.
- 4.3 **Authority to enter into Agreement.** Each party represents that it has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement. The person executing this Agreement on behalf of each party has been properly authorized and empowered to enter into this Agreement. The person executing this Agreement on behalf of FFT represents that he or she is authorized to sign on behalf of FFT and Agrees to provide proof of such authorized to the Town upon request.
- 4.4 **Agreement read.** The Parties acknowledge that they have read, understand and intend to be bound by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 4.5 **Notice.** All notices and documents required herein shall be sent and provided to the Parties at the addresses and telephone numbers listed below.

# INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN DENTON COUNTY, TEXAS, AND THE TOWN OF HICKORY CREEK, TEXAS

**THIS AGREEMENT** is made, entered into and executed by and between Denton County, Texas, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, hereinafter "the County," and the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas, a duly incorporated municipality, hereinafter "the Town." The County and the Town are collectively referred to herein as "the Parties."

WHEREAS, the County and the Town mutually desire to enter into this Agreement for the purpose of providing for design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction associated with the widening and improvements of Point Vista Road from Turbeville Road to Stamford Drive as a 3-lane undivided concrete road, and Turbeville Road from Point Vista Road to IH-35E Frontage Road as a four-lane divided concrete road, hereinafter "the Project," which is located within the municipal limits of the Town, and Denton County Commissioner Precinct #3; and

**WHEREAS**, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Texas Government Code Chapter 791, hereinafter "the Act," provides authorization for a local government to contract with one or more local governments to perform governmental functions and services under the terms of the Act, and the County and the Town hereby mutually agree to be subject to the provisions of the Act; and

**WHEREAS,** the County and the Town value the timely completion of the Project which involves roads which are an integral part of the County's road system, and the Parties are undertaking the Project to facilitate safe travel on an improved roadway; and

**NOW, THEREFORE,** this Agreement is hereby made and entered into by the County and the Town upon and for the mutual consideration stated herein:

### **WITNESSETH:**

I.

Pursuant to Texas Government Code §791.011, the County and the Town hereby enter into this Agreement in order to perform certain governmental functions and services in the area of streets, roads, and drainage. The purpose of this Agreement is to provide a governmental function or service that each party is authorized to perform individually.

The County and the Town hereby agree that the scope of the Project shall be to provide for design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction associated with the widening and improvements of Point Vista Road from Turbeville Road to Stamford Drive as a 3-lane undivided concrete road, and Turbeville Road from Point Vista Road to IH-35E Frontage Road as a four-lane divided concrete road at a cost of completion which shall not exceed TWO MILLION FIVE HUNDRED NINETY-NINE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$2,599,300.00).

#### III.

The County hereby agrees to contribute an amount toward satisfactory completion of the Project which shall not exceed TWO MILLION FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$2,400,000.00), provided that any and all funding is approved by formal action of the Denton County Commissioners Court.

#### IV.

The Town agrees to provide all necessary design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction required for satisfactory completion of the Project as well as an amount which shall not exceed ONE HUNDRED NINETY-NINE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$199,300.00).

### V.

The Town further agrees to secure a contract for the design and construction which may be required for satisfactory completion of the Project.

#### VI.

This exchange of in-kind services between the County and the Town is deemed adequate consideration for the obligations exchanged by the Parties herein.

### VII.

As the Town proceeds with the completion of the Project, the Town shall submit invoices for reimbursement to the Denton County Auditor, James Wells, 401 W. Hickory Street, Suite 423, Denton, Texas 76201, on a monthly basis, and the County shall reimburse the Town for all approved expenses related to the Project within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt of an invoice from the Town, provided that all expenditures are made in a manner which is consistent with the terms of the Agreement. Upon satisfactory completion of the Project, the County and the Town shall prepare and complete a full audit of the Project. The Town shall submit a copy of all invoices to Mr. John Polster,

c/o Innovative Transportation Solutions, Inc., 2701 Valley View Lane, Farmers Branch, Texas 75234, at the same time invoices are submitted to the County Auditor.

### VIII.

As required by Texas Transportation Code §251.012 and as evidenced by the signature of the Town's representative below, the governing body of the Town by the execution of and approval of this Agreement hereby approves of the expenditure of County money to finance the construction, improvement, maintenance, or repair of a street or alley in the County that is located in the Town.

#### IX.

This Agreement may be terminated in whole or in part by the County or the Town upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. In the event of termination by the County, the County shall pay all approved invoices submitted up to and including the date of termination.

### X.

This Agreement represents the entire integrated agreement between the County and the Town and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, and/or agreements, either oral or written. This Agreement may be amended only in writing, signed by both of the Parties. Notices shall be directed as follows:

The County agrees to accept full responsibility for the acts, negligence, and/or omissions of all County employees, agents, subcontractors, and/or contract laborers doing work under a contract or agreement with the County.

XV.

The Town agrees to accept full responsibility for the acts, negligence, and/or omissions of all Town employees, agents, subcontractors, and/or contract laborers doing work under a contract or agreement with the Town.

XVI.

This Agreement is not intended to extend the liability of the Parties beyond that provided for by law. Neither the County nor the Town waive, nor shall be deemed to have hereby waived, any immunity or defense that would otherwise be available to it against claims made by third parties.

#### XVII.

In the event that any portion of this Agreement shall be found to be contrary to law, it is the intent of the Parties hereto that the remaining portions shall remain valid and in full force and effect to the fullest extent possible.

#### XVIII.

The undersigned officers or agents of the Parties hereto are the properly authorized officials and have the necessary authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the Parties hereto, and each party hereby certifies to the other that any necessary resolutions extending said authority have been duly passed and are now in full force and effect.

#### **Brief Explanation:**

Since January 1, 2002, Police Departments, in accordance with the Texas Racial Profiling Law (S.B. No. 1074), have been collecting police contact data for the purpose of identifying and responding, if necessary, to concerns regarding racial profiling practices of law enforcement officers. The statistical data provided in this report is relevant to the public contacts made by our officers for the period of 01-01-17 through 12-31-17. The census data was compiled from the latest U.S. Census data on file with the North Central Texas Council of Governments as a means of determining the number of households and residents in the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas.

The majority of traffic stops performed by officers of the Hickory Creek Police Department during 2017 occurred on I-35E and its adjacent service roads. This is partially due to the number of complaints the police department receives from citizens regarding excessive speed, fail to yield right of way, and reckless driving on I-35E and the I-35E service roads. Another contributing factor is the fact that a large portion of the motor vehicle accidents reported to the Hickory Creek Police Department occur on I-35E and its service roads.

In the calendar year 2017, there were no formal complaints filed against officers in reference to racial profiling, and no accusations were made known to the Department.

The majority of traffic stops made by the officers (92.26%) are of non-residents with residents only accounting for 7.74% of total traffic stops made. This is attributed to the fact that the majority of traffic stops (69.74%) are occurring on the I-35E freeway and its related service roads.

Guidelines for Compiling and Reporting Data under Senate Bill 1074

Law enforcement agencies that routinely perform traffic stops or motor vehicle stops and who have their vehicles that routinely perform theses stops equipped with video and audio equipment can report under CCP 2.135. (This is called Tier 1 Reporting)

Our vehicles that conduct motor vehicle stops are equipped with video and audio equipment and we maintain videos for 90 days.







#### **Analysis**

According to the Texas Racial Profiling Law, all police departments in the state are required to collect data when a traffic-related citation is issued or an arrest is made. In addition, the law requires that agencies report this information to their local governing authority once a year by March 1. The purpose in collecting and presenting this information is to determine if a particular police officer is engaging in the practice of profiling minority motorists. Despite the fact that most agree it is good practice for police departments to be accountable to their community, it is very difficult to determine, from the review of aggregate data, if police departments are engaging in racial profiling. That is, it is challenging to detect specific "individual" racist behavior from the study and analysis of aggregate-level "institutional" data on traffic-related contacts.

It should be noted that the Hickory Creek Police Department, in response to the requirements of The Texas Racial Profiling Law (S.B. 1074), reported and analyzed its 2017 traffic contact data. Thus, two different types of analyses were conducted. The first of these involved a careful evaluation of the 2017 traffic-stop data. This particular analysis measured, as required by the Texas Racial Profiling Law, the number and percentage of Caucasians, African Americans, Hispanics, Asians, Native Americans, and individuals belonging to the "other" category, that came in contact with the police and were issued a traffic-related citation or arrested in 2017. In addition, the analysis included information relevant to the number and percentage of searches, while indicating the type of search (i.e., consensual or probable cause) conducted. Finally, the data analysis highlighted the number and percentage of individuals who, after they were issued a citation, were subsequently arrested.

The second type of analysis included in this report is related to the comparison of the 2016 traffic contact data with an appropriate baseline. It should be noted that there is also a great deal of disagreement, in the academic literature, over the type/form of baseline to be used when analyzing traffic-related contact information. Of all the baseline measures available, the Hickory Creek Police Department decided to adopt, as a baseline measure, the Fair Roads Standard. This particular baseline is based on data obtained through the U.S. Census Bureau (2010) relevant to the number of households in a particular jurisdiction that have access to vehicles while controlling for race and ethnicity. It should be noted that census data presents challenges to any effort made at establishing a fair and accurate racial profiling analysis. In other words, census data contains information on all residents of a particular community, regardless of the fact they may or may not be among the driving population.

The Hickory Creek Police Department opted to use this form of comparison (i.e., census data relevant to households with vehicles) in an attempt to demonstrate its transparency before the community. The Fair Roads Standard data obtained is relevant to the Town of Hickory Creek.

#### Tier 1 (2017) Traffic-Related Contact Analysis

The Tier 1 data collected in 2017 showed that of the 3,229 contacts, 2,286 were Caucasian males and females. Of those 2,286 contacts, Hickory Creek officers conducted a total of 107 searches, 20 of which being consensual searches and 33 probable cause searches. Of the 3,229 contacts, 608 contacts were African American males and females. Of those 608 contacts, Hickory Creek officers conducted a total of 63 searches, 5 of which being consensual searches and 18 probable cause searches. Of the 3,229 contacts, 156 were Hispanic males and females. Of those 156 contacts, Hickory Creek officers conducted a total of 22 searches, 2 of which being consensual searches and 4 of which being probable cause searches. Asian males and females accounted for 173 contacts where Hickory Creek officers conducted a total of 4 searches, 0 consensual searches and 1 probable cause search. Native American males and females accounted for zero contacts, where Hickory Creek officers conducted zero searches. Finally, zero contacts of an unknown or other race were conducted.

#### Fair Roads Standard Analysis

When comparing traffic contacts to the census data relevant to the number of households in Hickory Creek, who indicated in the 2010 census that they had access to vehicles, the analysis produced the following findings:

Of the 1165 households, 100% reported they have access to at least one vehicle. A total of 251 residents were contacted in 2017. 223 contacts identified as Caucasians, 18 contacts identified as African Americans, 5 contacts identified as Hispanics, and no contacts were identified as other/unknown races. Keep in mind the number of contacts refers to an individual coming into contact with a police officer. It does not reflect the number of citations (violations) issued. Police Officers issued a total of 4,789 citations between 01-01-2017 and 12-31-2017. Hickory Creek residents account for 3.93% of the total number of citations issued by the department.
